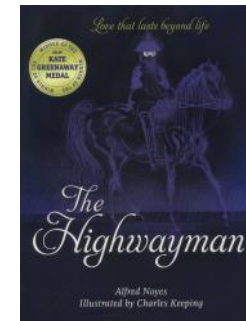
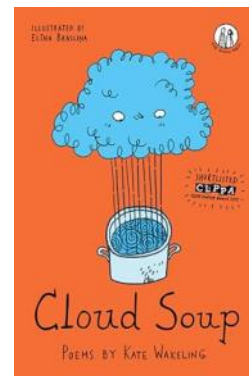
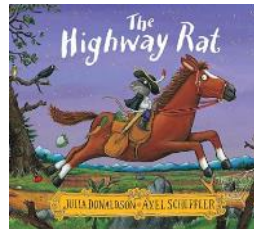
Early Islamic Civilization
