DYSLEXIA OUTREACH TEAM PARENT INFORMATION MEETING

The session will run from 9.15 - 10.15am

The Dyslexia outreach team are two specialist teachers, with a wealth of expert knowledge and experience in teaching and supporting students with Dyslexia and other learning difficulties. They will be leading a workshop on how to support your child at home with literacy skills.

This workshop is for parents/carers of children who:

- Demonstrate difficulties in acquiring age appropriate reading and writing skills.
- Have slow reading progress.
- Demonstrate a poorer standard of written work compared with oral ability.
- Demonstrate difficulties with working memory and processing skills (verbal or written)
- Have a diagnosis of Dyslexia or feel your child may potentially be Dyslexic.
