SUMMER 1

WHAT WOULD IT BE LIKE TO LIVE IN NIGERIA?

This term we will exploring the continent of Africa and specifically Nigeria. We will compare features of Nigeria to the United Kingdom. In science, we will learn about life cycles. Chick eggs will arrive at school and we we will have a first-hand experience of eggs hatching! We will take care of the chicks and watch them grown and develop. Maths

Estimate and measure mass (kg/g); temperature (°C); and capacity (litres/ml) to the nearest appropriate unit, using scales, thermometers and measuring vessels.

To compare and order mass, volume/capacity and record the results using >, < and =

To recognise, find, name and write fractions 1/2, 1/3, 1/4, 2/4 and 3/4 of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity.

To write simple fractions, for example 1/2 of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of 2/4 and 1/2.

We will explore A Lion in Paris and write our own narrative changing the setting of the story. We will focus on a range of skills, such as conjunctions, fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases.

We will also explore the features of nonchronological report and create our own version for African animals.

Science


Notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults.


Look at the similarities and differences of offspring and animals.


To understand the lifecycle of a human, a frog and a chicken.
