
## Year 3 Summer 1 - What was life like in Ancient Sumer?



Key vocabulary			
Artefact	An artefact is an object made by a human being. Artefacts include art, tools, and clothing made by people of any time and place.		
Mesopotamia	Mesopotamia is a Greek name that means "land between the rivers." It describes an ancient region between the Tigris and Euphrates rivers in the Middle East. Today the region is part of Iraq.		
Zigurrat	Huge temple buildings built in Mesopotamia. These temples were used as a place of worship by Ancient Sumer's.		
Gilgamesh	A hero in ancient Mesopotamian mythology. In Mesopotamian mythology Gilgamesh is a demigod, he is described as two thirds god and one third man, with superhuman strength.		
Akkadians	The Akkadians lived in northern Mesopotamia while the Sumerians lived in the south. They had a similar government and culture as the Sumerians, but spoke a different language.		
Shadow	A dark area or shape produced by a body coming between rays of light and a surface.		
Reflection	The throwing back of light from a surface.

In maths this term, we will consolidate 2D shapes before recognising, describing and drawing 3D shapes.  When completed, we will be moving onto fractions. Adding them together and subtracting them. Partitioning the whole into different fractions and solving reasoning problems.  After fractions, we are looking at money. We start by combining pounds and pence then moving to addition and subtraction of money finishing with ways to find change.  The half term finishes with us looking at time.
